Educational Tips for Focused Driving

- There are four types of distractions while driving:
 - VISUAL Looking at something other than the road.
 - AUDITORY Hearing or listening to something not related to driving.
 - MANUAL Manipulating something other than the steering wheel.
 - COGNITIVE Thinking about something other than driving.
- Park the phone before you drive; anything that takes your attention from driving puts you and everyone on the road in danger.
- If you're driving and need to respond to a phone call, text, or email, pull over in a safe area.
- If you have a passenger, ask them to be a designated texter.

Maryland's Distracted Driving Laws

- (TR 21-1124) Maryland law prohibits the use of a handheld cell phone or texting while driving.
 - The fine is \$83 for the first offense, escalates to \$140 for a second offense, and is \$160 for a third offense.
 - Drivers also can be ticketed \$70 and 1 point for writing, sending, or reading a text message while driving. If the use of the device contributes to a crash, the fine may increase to \$110 and 3 points.
- Jake's Law A driver who causes serious injury or death while talking on a handheld cell phone or texting may receive a prison sentence of up to 1 year and a fine of up to \$5,000.
