Matthew quickly turned Cheswick over, saving his life!


Thankful for his kindness, the two quickly became the best of friends.




While exploring Ocean City together, Matthew's kid brother Luke often tagged along.

"Wait for the WALK signal, then look left, right, then left to make sure it is safe to cross the road," said Cheswick. "Let's practice now. Look left, right and left again."






Seeing this danger, Cheswick decided to spend more time on Coastal Highway informing walkers, drivers and bicyclists to...




Sometimes, instead of walking on Coastal Highway, Cheswick, Matthew and Luke enjoyed biking around Ocean City.

They started telling parents to DRIVE SMART! Never use cell phones while driving, slow down and stay alert for people walking or biking.




The end of the summer was near, and that meant back to school for Matthew and Luke and back to the ocean for Cheswick.
