Educational Tips for Motorcycle Safety

- When riding a motorcycle:
 - Wear proper gear it's your best defense in the event of a crash.
 - Always make yourself visible.
 - Signal your intentions to drivers.
 - Learn to ride safely and seek additional motorcycle training when available.
 - Give yourself time and space to react.
- When driving a vehicle, it's critical to look out for motorcyclists:
 - Look twice before turning or changing lanes.
 - Remember that motorcycles are smaller than cars and riders are more vulnerable.
 - · Minimize and check your blind spots.

Maryland's Motorcycle Laws

- (TR 21-1306) A person may not operate a motorcycle in Maryland unless:
 - The individual is wearing protective headgear (helmet) that meets the established standards for such equipment (DOT-approved).
 - They are wearing an approved eye-protective device, or the motorcycle is equipped with a windscreen.
- To drive a motorcycle in Maryland, drivers need a Class M license.
- Anyone under the age of 18 must complete the Maryland Motorcycle Safety Program's Basic Rider Course before applying for a motorcycle license.
- Lane splitting is illegal in Maryland.
